

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.




Career & Technical Education

Emma Wink loves being part of the OCM BOCES TEAM program at C.W. Baker High School in Baldwinsville.

She enjoys her growing circle of friends, and she can practice her independent living skills during field trips to restaurants, Wegman’s, the Dollar Tree and other community destinations.

Emma has formed a strong connection with the school’s “Baker Buddies,” a group of students who volunteer in the TEAM classroom and other parts of the school to serve as peers and mentors. The “buddies” engage with Emma and her BOCES friends by modeling activities, interacting with them, encouraging them to try new things, and enjoying some leisure time at school through walks, games and videos.

Because of these interactions, as well as the classroom work, Emma’s confidence in her abilities “has increased greatly over the past two years,” said her teacher, Oliva Doner.

“Emma’s peer circle has grown exponentially,” Doner said. “She has always been a very independent young lady, but the introduction of this program and the further development of her communication skills has made her much more willing to socialize with others.”

Outside the classroom, community outings have helped Emma with skills such as navigating unfamiliar environments, listing her wants and needs, socializing with others, and selecting and paying for items. In restaurants, Emma and her classmates have learned to order food and practice their table manners.

“I’m really proud of Emma,” Doner said. “She is a very strong girl who has learned to advocate for herself and be an active participant in our classroom.”

Kim Kerzezi, a teaching assistant, agrees.

“Emma is a great student,” Kerzezi said. “She works really hard and is motivated and determined to do well.”

Did You Know?

The Baldwinsville Central School District trained 10 individuals as certified instructors in teen Mental Health First Aid (tMHFA) this past summer. tMFA is an evidence-based program delivered to students by certified tMHFA instructors. The program helps students recognize the signs and symptoms of mental health or substance use challenges in themselves and their peers and teaches them how to access help from a trusted adult.
