Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.



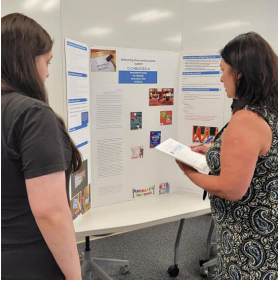
Career & Technical Education

OCM BOCES & Chittenango = Student Success



OCM BOCES Instructor Nicholas DeRocha describes Chittenango senior Ava Dobrzenski as a “natural born leader” in the Media Marketing Communications program at WCNY Studios in downtown Syracuse.

During a recent filming project, Ava had a vision for the assignment, communicated it well, and worked as

the director so the team could be successful. This once-quiet student is now a leader in the class and excited about acquiring new skills in script writing, editing and operating a camera.

“Ava is a hard worker and always challenges herself to do better,” DeRocha said.

Ava spends half of each school day at WCNY — a public media organization — where projects span TV, radio, social media, and web and print platforms. Students get firsthand knowledge of the industry and work side-by-side with WCNY professionals on a variety of projects. They can also take advantage of dual credit courses offered through Onondaga Community College, giving them a jump-start on college.

“I love learning about news,” Ava said, “and I love exploring different topics.”

Ava’s goal is to someday work for a police vice unit and become a professional documentary filmmaker, so the skills she is learning in the Media Marketing Communications program are building a strong foundation for that career. It’s also providing two more benefits that Ava appreciates — friendships with classmates who have similar interests and connections to professionals in the field.

In Chittenango, teachers are impressed with Ava’s progress and passion.

Math teacher Jay Wingard said Ava has proven to be “a true thinker” — someone who may seem quiet but has well-thought-out and intriguing ideas that are bound to help her achieve success.

English teacher Emily Norman said she’s not surprised at Ava’s drive within the OCM BOCES program because the same drive motivates her in art, fashion, academics and in her determination to improve herself and the world around her.

Ava “is constantly striving to evolve and grow both as a person and a student,” Norman said.

Chittenango’s Fine Arts Department continues to have a strong representation in the Fine Arts Leadership Network facilitated through OCM BOCES.
