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

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-



duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.

Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.



The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

Jamber is a model student in this two-year Career & Technical Education program, which gives students the skills to become entry-level welders or a significant headstart in their post-secondary education. Jamber wants a career in welding, so she works hard and efficiently during her half-day sessions at OCM

BOCES and spends "many hours in her booth, honing her skills and perfecting her welds," Instructor Kevin Auyer said.

"She's a joy to have in class," Auyer said. "She is organized and mission-focused and can take on whatever role is needed."

Jamber says weld tests are difficult, but she loves the challenge. The program has taught her patience and persistence to learn skills that are much more complex than they initially appear, she said. It has also given her more confidence in herself and her ability to take on leadership roles in the classroom.

Classmate Gracie-Jo Homza said she admires Jamber's confidence and her determination to succeed. Another classmate, Montana Marshall, said she appreciates Jamber "for constantly pushing people to be their best."

"She always pushes you to do more than you think you can," Montana said.

Did You Know?

The Cincinnatus Central School District conducted an assessment study under the guidance of Dr. Jennifer Eddy, director of World Languages at Queens College. French teacher Amanda Silva tested all of her students across the levels of proficiency checkpoints A, B, and C and obtained baseline scores. Under the tutelage of Dr. Eddy, Amanda proceeded to create and deliver standards-based lessons intentionally designed to address student's individual and collective learning. The same students were tested at the end of the school year and showed amazing growth, with many scoring at the level required for the New York State Seal of Biliteracy on several modalities. Amanda diligently documented her results, and this study has positively impacted students of World Languages beyond the work at Cincinnatus.
