## SPOTLIGHT: OCM BOCES Embedded Programs

### Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



### Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

## OCM BOCES & Cortland = Student Success



Cortland sophomore Cowen Cramer enjoys Seven Valleys New Tech Academy for three distinct reasons: His grades have improved, he likes the smaller class sizes, and he can focus on his work because the school environment offers fewer distractions than a large high school.

His facilitators agree. They say Cowen has experienced steady growth at Seven Valleys — both academically and socially — through the school's focus on Project Based Learning, or PBL, which requires students to collaborate on challenges and problems from the real world. As part of the PBL process, students connect with experts in their communities and routinely give presentations in front of the class.

English Facilitator Danielle Dillon said Cowen works well in the school's PBL environment and has grown noticeably more confident in his abilities since he first enrolled as a freshman. This year, she said, Cowen has advanced even further to take

on leadership roles among his peers. He also acts as a role model by holding himself accountable for his work, including any makeup work, she said.

“Cowen has found a niche group of peers that helps him excel, and he supports them as well,” Dillon said. “He also uses his class time effectively.”

Science Facilitator Jake Melnyk said Cowen recently led his team on a project that involved creating a “climate change insurance policy” based on the phenomenon’s impact on weather. Melnyk was impressed at Cowen’s dedication to the project and his openness to feedback.

“Cowen used his knowledge of Adobe Photoshop to create an initial document, then refined his design with his team members to create a quality project,” he said.

“Cowen is consistently prepared and on task in his classwork and has developed positive relationships with his peers,” he added. “He provides good insights and a positive influence in the classroom.”

## Did You Know?

During the 2022-2023 school year, science teacher Theresa Johnson participated in a trip to the Naval Undersea Warfare Center in Newport, Rhode Island, with a group of educators from Central New York. During the trip, the group learned from U.S. Naval scientists and engineers about how they use science, engineering and technology in their work. Theresa then returned to Cortland and developed lessons using the “7E” instructional model with support from OCM BOCES science trainer Angela Francis. Theresa shared her work with teachers around the region at a Science Leadership Network meeting held in May at OCM BOCES.
