# SPOTLIGHT: OCM BOCES Embedded Programs

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-



duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.

#### Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.



The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

#### Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

In 2023, these seniors from ESM were eligible for CTE endorsements: Aidan Hirt and Chloe Spencer.

#### **Seal of Civic Readiness**

To earn the Seal of Civic Readiness, students must demonstrate an understanding and commitment to making a positive difference in their communities through civic knowledge, skills, actions, mindsets and experiences. At OCM BOCES, 58 seniors in our Innovative Education and

## OCM BOCES & East Syracuse Minoa = Student Success



As a junior, Brooke Kirkpatrick knew that enrolling in the OCM BOCES New Vision Engineering Professions program at Lockheed Martin would offer a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for a high school student to work side-by-side with professional engineers, earn college credits, and learn in an on-site classroom at one of the

biggest aerospace and military support companies in the world.

This year, that vision became reality. As a senior, Brooke works on authentic projects with Lockheed engineers every Monday and every other Tuesday. Already, she has created two spreadsheets with her lead engineer that the company plans to use. Outside of her time with the Lockheed engineers, Brooke and her classmates dive into engineering-related concepts in a classroom taught by OCM BOCES instructor Jim Maniccia and earn college credits in English through Onondaga Community College.

Maniccia says Brooke is perfect for the program because she is "eager to learn as much possible" and her interactions with Lockheed employees "certainly has had a positive impact on her already positive attitude."

"Brooke is such a hardworking student, it is no surprise to me that she has a 100 average," Maniccia said. "Either working on a written assignment or constructing a project, Brooke does not stop until she is completely satisfied with the result."

Over the course of her childhood, Brooke has been passionate about solving problems, inventing products, and supporting environmental sustainability, she said. That's why her interests have zeroed in on mechanical engineering, which she plans to study at a four-year university after high school.

The New Vision Engineering Professions program, she said, has affirmed her passion for that field and given her a jump-start on her career "unlike anything I could receive elsewhere."

"By learning about and working in the field of engineering every day, I feel as though I am making helpful strides toward my future," Brooke said. "The experience I get by working with my lead engineer will benefit me the rest of my career."

Maniccia agrees.

"Through the interactions with Lockheed professionals, visitors to our program, industry tours and the curriculum, Brooke has many valuable tools for her future," he said.

#### Did You Know?

The East Syracuse Minoa Central School District currently has 12 students attending the OCM BOCES Virtual Learning Academy, or VLA. The VLA is broken up into grades 5-6 for elementary school, 7-8 for middle school, and 9-12 for high school. Teachers deliver "live" instruction via Google Meet throughout a traditional bell-scheduled day to students who cannot attend school in person. Teachers engage students in the curriculum by utilizing technology, delivering interactive lessons, and using breakout rooms for group work. Last year, East Syracuse Minoa had 14 students who attended the VLA, and two students graduated from the program.
