SPOTLIGHT: OCM BOCES Embedded Programs

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.



Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

Innovation Tech has provided a warm, welcoming environment for Fayetteville-Manlius junior Aleia Kavisic, who loves the school’s small class sizes and the friendships she has formed since enrolling in the program last year.

“I find it easier to learn, and I feel like I am getting a great education,” she said. “I’ve been able to go through life more easily and with more confidence than I had before.”

English Facilitator Kayla Cook says Aleia has made significant strides in her ability to socialize, collaborate with her classmates, connect with her facilitators, and present her work in front of others. Early on, Aleia was reluctant to read aloud in class — now she does it willingly.

“Her confidence has soared,” Cook said. “Aleia seems happy and comfortable here at Innovation Tech, and she always has a positive attitude, even in the face of a setback.”

This year, Aleia is taking advantage of another OCM BOCES

program — the Early Childhood Education program in the OCM BOCES Career & Technical Education (CTE) building across the street from Innovation Tech.

Aleia spends her mornings at the high school and her afternoons in CTE, which offers a part-time preschool within its spacious classroom. Students learn about early childhood development and get to apply their knowledge and skills with the energetic young children who spend time with them each week.

Overall, the Early Childhood Education program has bolstered Aleia's creativity, planning and organizational skills. Her instructor in the program, Melissa Kershner, says Aleia has shown “great patience and compassion when she interacts with preschoolers in the classroom” and works hard to finish all of her assignments.

Her care for the children extends to her relationships at Innovation Tech.

“Aleia has such a sweet and caring soul,” Cook said. “Her kindness shows through each day.”

In the spring of 2023, an exhilarating and highly competitive event took place with more than 80 enthusiastic students from Fayetteville-Manlius competing in the Battle of the Books. After this event, one FM team moved on to compete in the Regional Battle of the Books, which pitted them against more than 25 other teams from districts around the region.
