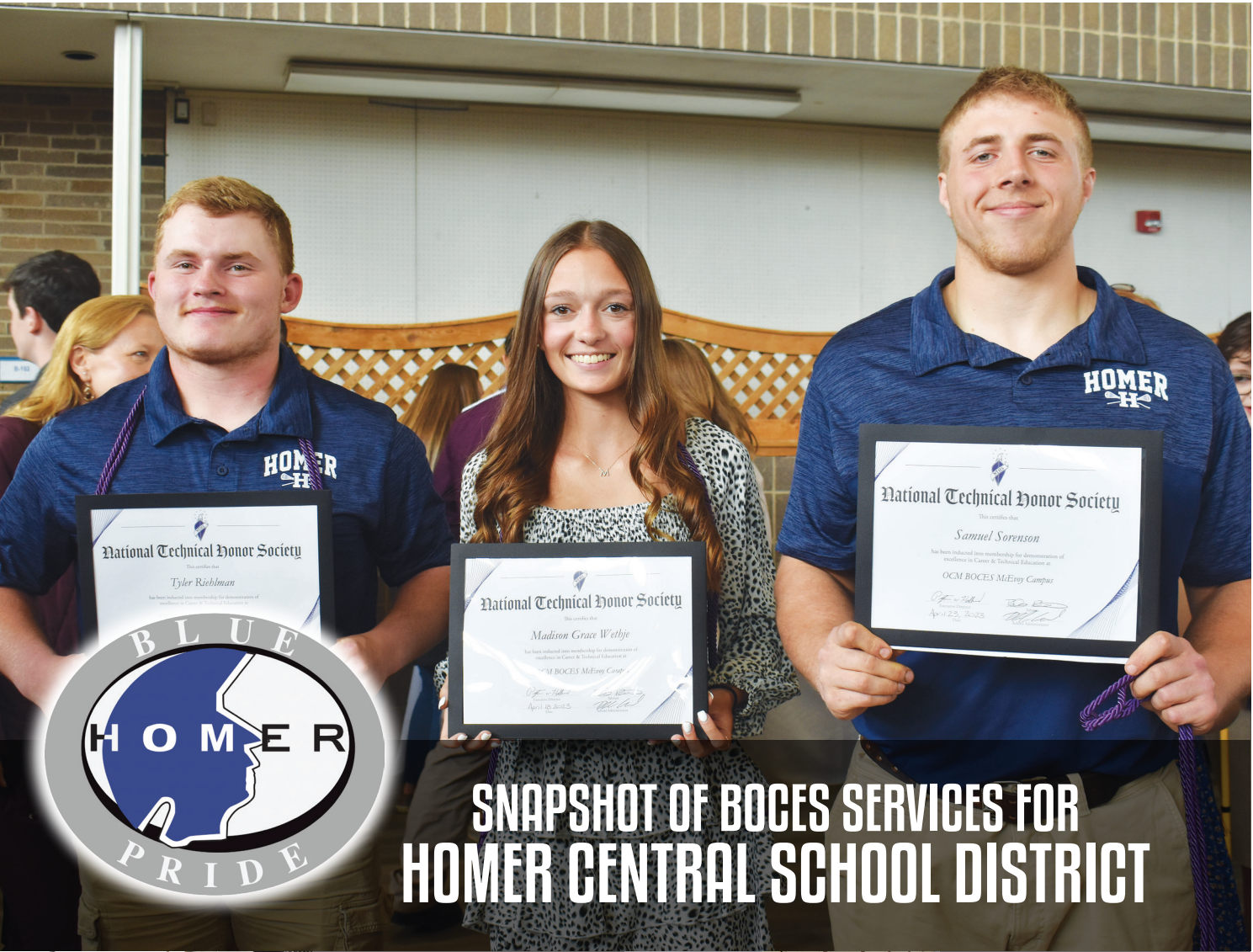

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

OCM BOCES & Homer = Student Success



Homer High School sophomore Madison Phillips has benefited greatly from Seven Valleys New Tech Academy, where her social and academic skills have soared and she now possesses the confidence to give presentations, help her classmates, and seek out help when she needs it.

“When Madison first entered the program, she was more likely to stick to herself,” Facilitator Sam Prentiss said. “Now Madison has a good-sized group of friends she can socialize with throughout the day. On the academic side, she makes excellent use of her class time and helps the students around her, especially if she notices them struggling with an assignment.”

Madison says she is grateful for Seven Valleys because of its small, tight-knit community, her close connections with facilitators, and its primary emphasis on Project Based Learning.

“Projects are great because you get to work with others,” she said. “But it’s not just about the work — it’s about bigger things

like collaboration, communication and presentations. That has really helped my grades.”

Madison says she is motivated to work hard because she doesn’t want to disappoint her peers or facilitators when they work on group projects. She also thinks the speaking and collaboration skills she has learned at Seven Valleys have helped her communicate at work and home. Outside of school, Madison loves to bake and routinely helps her grandmother make pizza, bread and muffins for a local bowling alley.

Facilitators at Seven Valleys have a long list of positive things to say about Madison. They describe her as artistic, creative, self-reflecting, open to feedback, determined and willing to tackle new challenges.

“Madison has a genuinely positive influence in the classroom and on her community as a whole,” Math Facilitator Areg Zaratsyan said. “She provides a good example of how to succeed in this environment.”

“Madison has found a good support system at Seven Valleys,” added English Facilitator Danielle Dillon. “She knows how to get help when she is struggling and advocates for others.”

Lancy Collins from the Homer Central School District has been a dedicated and invaluable participant in the OCM BOCES Tech Coach Collaborative, which allows educators to discuss and share information about the state’s Computer Science and Digital Fluency Learning Standards and how to incorporate them in K-12 classrooms.
