Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician


This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

Liverpool senior Brianna Lee has everything she needs to become an excellent nurse: compassion, dedication, a warm smile, and a strong foundation of knowledge and clinical experience through the two-year OCM BOCES Health Occupations program at the Thompson Road Campus.

Brianna enrolled in the program as a junior to explore the healthcare field. Now she's sold on it. She was the first in her class this year to get medical clearance so can continue performing clinical work at Loretto Health & Rehabilitation, a nursing home in Syracuse. Brianna loved her clinical work at Loretto last year and "could not wait to return," said her OCM BOCES instructor, Tracy Finke, BSN, RN.

In the classroom, Brianna is working toward her goal of successfully taking the state exam to become a Certified Nursing Assistant or CNA. That certification, along with her experience, will give her a significant head start when she attends a nursing school after graduation, Finke said. Brianna's goal is to become a registered nurse and eventually work in an emergency department. She likes

the idea of working in a challenging, fast-paced environment so she can think on her feet and use all her skills.

Finke says Brianna is bound to be successful.

"Brianna has matured into a capable, genuine, caring young lady who takes pride in her work in both the classroom and clinical setting," Finke said. "She has both the motivation and determination to achieve her goal of becoming an excellent emergency department registered nurse."

At Thompson Road, Brianna has become a leader in the classroom. Every morning, when the class gathers for a check-in meeting, she is always willing to share her thoughts "as a way of promoting conversation and giving the group, as a whole, something to think about," Finke said.

At Loretto, she has an excellent rapport with the residents.

"It's obvious she cares for her residents and enjoys helping them," said Shawnica Sullivan, RN, a clinical instructor for the Health Occupations program. "She is responsible and attentive to their various needs and wants to perform better each time she completes a skill."
