
Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

OCM BOCES & Lyncourt = Student Success



Lyncourt seventh-grader Draysen Cuffee is a bright and curious young man who likes to read, play games and participate in community-building activities at the OCM BOCES Crown Road Campus.

But his biggest talent — drawing — elicits the highest praise from his teacher, his social worker, and other staff in the building. Draysen, for example, drew an impressive wilderness and water scene after his class read the Newbery award-winning novel “Hatchet,” a suspenseful story about a 13-year-old boy who has to survive in the woods following a plane crash.

He also drew a “buddy bench” with a rainbow behind it after he and his class watched “Ron’s Gone Wrong,” a movie about friendship and the imperfections of technology. In the film, a teacher puts a “buddy bench” on the school playground as a designated spot to make friends.

Most recently, Draysen drew a Grinch to help a teaching assistant decorate a classroom door for the holidays.

“Drawing is Draysen’s outlet for everything,” said his teacher, Havyn Bush. “That’s how he expresses himself and how he calms himself ... I often tell him he should be a comic book artist.”

Bush is proud of Draysen’s progress at Crown Road, where he benefits academically from a small classroom and one-on-one attention from staff. Drayson connects well with the staff, performs at grade level, and loves to ask questions.

“He has grown and he has learned what works for him, and he will try to do that in the moment,” said Lisa Lioto, his social worker. “He’s doing great, and I’m excited to see how he blossoms.”

Draysen also enjoys the school community. He says hello to people in the hallways and loves participating in special weeks — spirit weeks, theme weeks and holiday weeks, for example — that bring everyone together.

His generosity is apparent, too. He taught Lioto how to whistle, always encouraging her to never give up because he knew first-hand how difficult it was to learn. That spirit of compassion extends to his drawing.

“Draysen is extremely artistic and he’s very kind, too,” Lioto said. “I think he likes to make others feel better through his artwork.”

Did You Know?

Lyncourt has taken an impressive step in supporting its school community by aligning its resources and joining the OCM BOCES Community Schools Cooperative Service Agreement, or CoSer. Lyncourt administrators are excited to see the potential benefits, which include improved student learning, stronger families, healthier neighborhoods and supporting students’ social, emotional, physical and intellectual needs. In September, for example, Lyncourt opened the Lyncourt Community fitness center, which is free for community members. Lyncourt is now hoping to add fitness classes based on community interest.
