SPOTLIGHT: OCM BOCES Embedded Programs

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.




Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

Marathon senior Brook Morsey is heading for a promising career in nursing after discovering her passion in the OCM BOCES Health Occupations program at the Cortlandville Campus.

Last spring, after her first full year in the program, Brook started working as a resident assistant at the Crown Park Rehabilitation and Nursing Center on Kellogg Road. This year, she is excelling in her second year of the OCM BOCES program, continuing her work at Crown Park, and pushing toward her goal of passing the New York State exam to become a Certified Nursing Assistant, or CNA.

Next fall, she wants to expand her knowledge even further by going to Tompkins Cortland Community College to become a registered nurse.

“Learning what I have here at BOCES will put me ahead of a lot of people in college,” Brook said. “My teachers have done a great job preparing me to go to college and into the workforce.”

Her OCM BOCES teacher, Laura Swayze, says Brook has

emerged over the past year as the “go-to” person among her classmates and a true class leader. Brook “comes in every day with a smile on her face and puts 100% into everything she does,” Swayze said.

Brook is also a role model because she embraces the idea of learning new skills and isn’t afraid to participate in activities such as SkillsUSA, Swayze said. Last year, Brook worked hard to prepare for the competition and took second place in the “basic healthcare skills” category at the regional SkillsUSA event, which qualified her for the state SkillsUSA competition at the New York State Fairgrounds.

“To be able to compete and place second as a first-year student is fantastic,” Swayze said.

At Crown Park, administrators have nothing but nice things to say about Brook.

“It has been wonderful having Brook as part of the Crown Park family,” said Director of Human Services Amber Norris. “We wish her all the best during her senior year of high school and look forward to having her continue with us as a Certified Nursing Assistant!”

The Marathon Central School District is building its Community Schools framework, which focuses on supporting improved student learning, stronger families, healthier neighborhoods and addressing students’ social, emotional, physical and intellectual needs.
