Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.




Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.



Career & Technical Education


Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

North Syracuse senior Joseph Kozubowski is a model student in the OCM BOCES Culinary & Pastry Arts program at the Thompson Road Campus.

He is diligent about finishing his work in the kitchen and classroom. He helps other students with their questions. He excels academically. Last year, he scored a 94 on the Year 1 final exam — one of the highest grades ever recorded, said his teacher, Bob Cannoro. Joseph also finished an internship last year at Toss & Fire Pizza, an experience that immediately led to a summer job.

Joseph, in turn, loves the program. He toured the campus during his sophomore year and knew it would be a perfect fit.

“What appealed to me most about BOCES was the amount of hands-on work we get to do, as well as the in-depth learning,” he said.

In addition to practicing culinary skills, students learn about the hospitality side of the business. Those skills have helped Joseph excel at his current job at Cinnabon. They will also give him a leg-up when he goes to Onondaga Community College in the fall of 2024 to major in hospitality management.

Looking ahead, Joseph hopes to someday own a restaurant.

BOCES, he said, has been a good first step.

“It’s giving me the knowledge I need to achieve my future dreams,” he said.
