Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-



duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.

Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.



The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

In 2023, these seniors from Onondaga were eligible for CTE endorsements: Cole Barr, Dakota Neuman, Theodore Thivierge, Madison Town, and Jonathan Underberg.

OCM BOCES & Onondaga = Student Success



Like most high school sophomores, Payton O'Conner can be a little reticent about doing household chores such as folding laundry, setting the table or making a bed.

Learning these essential living skills is part of the curriculum in the OCM BOCES Transition program at the Cortlandville

Campus. Payton and his classmates focus on academics in the morning and switch to hands-on, daily living skills in the afternoon.

Russ Scira, their teacher, says Payton finds a great deal of comfort in this routine, and he never wants to miss one lesson in particular — cooking. Every Friday, Payton and his classmates learn how to prepare dishes such as spaghetti and meatballs, casseroles, personal pan pizzas, and just about any food they request.

"Yes, Payton loves cooking," Scira said. "In fact, he always asks me two or three days in advance about what we're going to make."

Payton also loves going to SUNY Cortland, where college students run a physical education class for students in the Transition program. Payton enjoys playing basketball and soccer and looks forward to the field trip every week. Eventually, he hopes to get a job on campus, maybe even work in a kitchen.

Payton is one of the youngest students in the Transition program, but he has found a home. His concentration has improved, he routinely finishes his work, he has learned some effective coping strategies, and he performs well overall because he is comfortable and friendly with his classmates, Scira said.

"He's just really enjoyable to have in class, and we're really happy to have him with us," he said.

Payton agrees.

"I like my classmates, and I like going to the college program," he said. "It's fun."

Did You Know?

The Onondaga Central School District's library team collaborated with the OCM BOCES School Library System this year to develop a Guaranteed & Viable Curriculum for its school library program. They began by establishing "non-negotiables" for each grade level and assessing their alignment with the state's Computer Science and Digital Fluency Learning Standards. They also evaluated their existing practices within the framework of the Empire State Information Fluency Continuum. In addition, Onondaga Library Media Specialist Ellen Pristash continued her unwavering commitment to assisting fellow librarians in the region by providing support to her mentee as part of the Mentors Across Borders cohort.
