Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-



duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.

Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.



The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.

Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

Inside the OCM BOCES SKATE program at Minoa Elementary School, fourth-grader Anthony Utano "has found his voice," said his teacher, Mary Beth Crysler.

It is a life-changing accomplishment. Anthony, who has autism, has excelled this year at using a communication device to express his wants and needs, his feelings, and his level of understanding with academic tasks. The colorful tablet has synthesized speech, symbols, images, videos and other features that bolster his learning and help him navigate through his school environment.

"Once Anthony started to use his device more consistently, and he was able to communicate with us, we started to see progress across all areas of his school day," Crysler said.

Every day, Anthony receives specialized instruction and support inside his OCM BOCES SKATE classroom, where visual and written schedules give him clarity about his routine and help him transition from one activity to another, Crysler said.

He also benefits from opportunities to learn and socialize outside the BOCES classroom with other Minoa Elementary School peers. Every day, Anthony joins them for lunch, recess, and "specials" such as art, music and physical education. His favorite activities are not surprising for a boy his age — running around at recess and playing on the swings outside.

Inside the school, where OCM BOCES has housed an in-district classroom for the past two years, staff members appreciate Anthony. They describe him as smart, playful and engaging. They also note his smile, which rarely disappears.

"Anthony is generally a happy-go-lucky child," Crysler said. "We very much appreciate his happy nature in the classroom!"

Did You Know?

The Solvay Union Free School District trained two individuals as certified instructors in teen Mental Health First Aid (tMHFA) this past summer and will be the first OCM BOCES district to implement the program this year. tMFA is an evidence-based program delivered to students by certified tMHFA instructors. The program helps students recognize the signs and symptoms of mental health or substance use challenges in themselves and their peers and teaches them how to access help from a trusted adult.
