## SPOTLIGHT: OCM BOCES Embedded Programs

### Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



### Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.




## Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

## OCM BOCES & Tully = Student Success



Tully junior Jackson Lennox seemed to be a quiet, reserved student when he first arrived in Brian Holl's classroom this fall for the Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology program at OCM BOCES.

That first impression, however, did not last long. Holl soon discovered that Jackson possessed “an intelligence beyond his years” and a special “curiosity in his eyes” the moment he and his classmates stepped inside their shop at All County Collision & Repair in Homer.

Jackson quickly consumed knowledge and excelled in multiple tasks, such as learning about hydraulics and telling his teacher “everything there is to know about tearing down a gear pump and what to look for while rebuilding it,” Holl said. Jackson loved building his own hoisting cable for one of the class units and challenged his teacher to see who could lift the device faster.

“I won’t say who won the race, but I will let you know it wasn’t in my favor,” Holl said.

For Jackson, attending this two-year Career & Technical Education program is one of the favorite parts of his day, but it’s

not the only OCM BOCES program he attends — and loves.

As a ninth-grader, Jackson enrolled in Cortland Alternative School (CAS) because the small class sizes and one-on-one attention from its staff drew him in. The success he has had in his classes, he said, affirms that choice. He loves the “family spirit” of the school and his close connections to teachers.

CAS teachers say Jackson’s desire to learn — that twinkle of curiosity — is not just limited to the CTE program.

“Jackson has become not only an excellent, curious conversationalist but has also shot to the top of his classes since joining us,” said Doug Rice, an English teacher.

“His contributions to class are positive and help raise the quality of discussion for everyone,” added Brendan Gilligan, his social studies teacher.

All of Jackson’s qualities — his maturity, his social skills and his burgeoning knowledge of a skilled trade, among other positive attributes — point to a successful future.

“Jackson is thoughtful, successful and a great success story from CAS,” said Lucien Hudson, an English teacher.
