

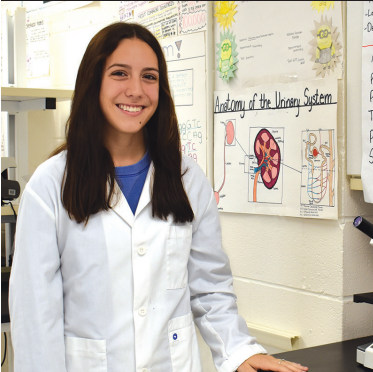

SPOTLIGHT: OCM BOCES Embedded Programs

Heavy Equipment Repair, Operations & Diesel Technology

This year, 70 juniors and seniors have enrolled in this two-year Career & Technical Education program located at All-County Collision & Repair in Homer and Tracey Road Equipment in East Syracuse. Students learn essential skills in the operation and repair of heavy machinery and heavy-duty diesel trucks using the latest techniques and diagnostic equipment. An experienced classroom instructor and on-site professionals are getting them well-prepared for a potential career in this high-demand industry.



Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician

This new, two-year Career & Technical Education program is off to a busy start at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic. The half-day class combines an on-site classroom with access to facilities, rescue equipment and highly dedicated emergency responders.




Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

OCM BOCES & Westhill = Student Success



The two-year OCM BOCES Construction Technology program is perfectly tailored to students like Westhill senior Kyle Andrella, who wants to join Carpenters Local 277 after high school and launch a career as a professional carpenter.

Kyle loves the idea of turning something he loves into a full-time job.

“This program made me realize that I can go into a career that feels like a hobby and not a job,” he said. “I enjoy spending my time building things and being hands-on.”

In addition to learning a wide range of carpentry skills, Kyle says the program has given him a stronger work ethic, better communication skills, and a greater appreciation for teamwork.

Kyle and his classmates work on several projects in the program, but their ultimate goal is to build a house from the ground up. They do framing, roofing, drywall, trim, windows, doors, siding, electrical, plumbing and a litany of other tasks to complete the house over two years. The house sits directly behind the construction shop on the Thompson Road Campus. Once complete, BOCES sells it through an auction.

Construction teacher Zachary Wills says Kyle has grown into a role model and leader for his fellow students over the past two years.

“Kyle’s ability to work as a team leader has greatly improved,” Wills said. “As a second-year student, he has gained a lot more confidence to take on leadership roles and help other students with tasks they might be struggling with.”

Kyle performed exceptionally well this year when the class worked on framing the house, a skill that bodes well for his future as a carpenter.

“I like the challenges of the class and that I’m always working to improve my trade-related skills,” he said.

Did You Know?

During the 2022-2023 school year, the Westhill Central School District dove into creating a new strategic plan for continuous improvement. Through interviews and surveys, they collected data to create priority focus areas for the next few years. In addition, a core committee came together to choose priorities, outline goals and set up actions teams. The action teams include stakeholders from across the district, making this a truly collaborative effort to increase buy-in and to ensure all voices are heard, respected and celebrated in the plan’s development.
