

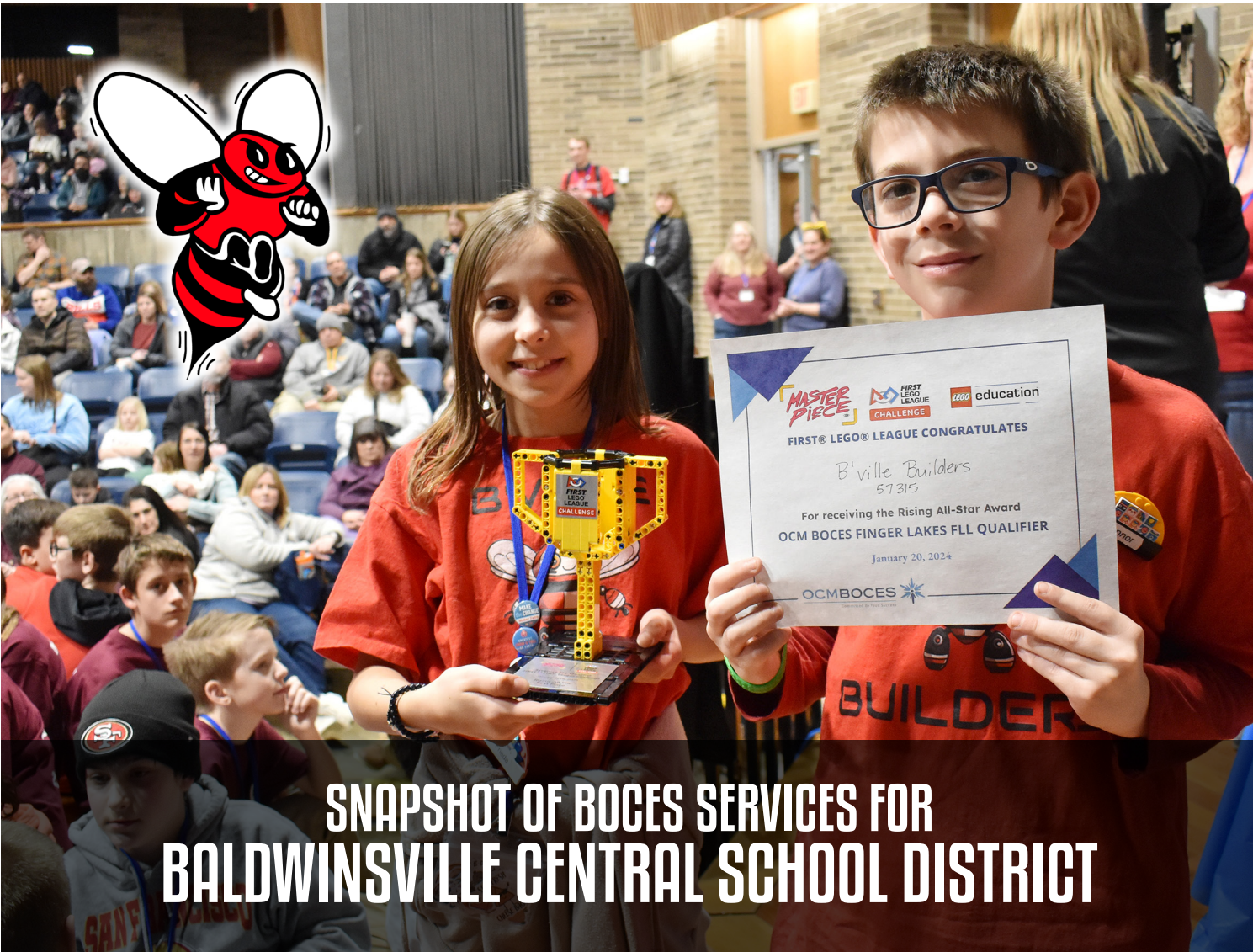

Building Community

Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you’ll probably discover a regular “check-in” circle in which students and staff share their thoughts, feelings and forge close connections. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.



Firefighting & EMT program

This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an on-site classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.

OCM BOCES has had a profound influence on Baldwinsville senior Nevaeh Thornton. Her high school career at Innovation Tech and the nearby Laboratory Technician program have helped her develop strong relationships, gain confidence in herself and fuel an enduring passion for a career in the medical field.

“Immediately, it was clear that Nevaeh was serious about her education and a natural leader with a contagious laugh, great sense of humor and strong intellect,” Buckley said. “I was immediately struck by her desire to discover the deeper meaning in the texts we read and to fully explore every historical context of every event we studied. She always volunteered to answer questions, play devil’s advocate in debates, and help out struggling classmates.”

As a junior, Nevaeh enrolled in the Laboratory Technology program, which is housed in the OCM BOCES Career & Technical Education building right across the street from Innovation Tech. The Laboratory Technology program has shown Nevaeh “that if you have a goal or a dream related to the medical field, go for it!” she said. “People are there to guide you—both students and the teacher—and you don’t need to be the expert.”

In both programs, Nevaeh has embraced the close-knit family atmosphere, where caring teachers are determined to help her learn but also ask her how’s she doing. In her Laboratory Technology program, Nevaeh enjoys the classroom routine of “check-in circles,” where students can talk about their feelings and support each other.

This year, as a senior, Nevaeh has come into her own. Buckley recounted a recent day when Nevaeh was preparing a speech to run for school president. Quietly, Nevaeh talked with two other candidates running for the position. “This is really hard guys,” Nevaeh told them. “I want to be school president, but I would also be honored to lose that position to one of you two.”

“This is the kind of person Nevaeh is,” Buckley noted. “She embodies the quote, ‘Be the change you want to see in the world.’”
