Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular "check-in" circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close



connections with classmates and teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.

Firefighting & EMT program

Chittenango senior Owen Clark earned his Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) certification in 2023-24, the inaugural year of this two-year Firefighting & Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) program at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. This year, he's working toward




his EMT-Basic certification. This relatively new Career & Technical Education program provides these benefits and more, combining an on-site classroom with access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders.

OCM BOCES & Chittenango = Student Success



For Chittenango senior Owen Clark, the two-year OCM BOCES Firefighting and Emergency Medical Technician program directly aligns with his career goals. He plans to attend Onondaga Community College, earn a fire service degree, and become a full-time professional firefighter for the city of Syracuse.

Owen was one of the program's inaugural students when it kicked off in 2023-24. He and his classmates benefit from an on-site classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center, which provides access to facilities, equipment, and trained personnel in the firefighting and emergency medical fields. Owen and his classmates routinely do hands-on learning with turnout gear, ladders, fire hoses, trucks, CPR manikins, and other equipment.

Owen completed all the firefighting training modules during his first year in the program and received his certification in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO). This year, he is working toward his certification in Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic and will be eligible to take the state exam in June.

Justin Norfleet is the instructor. He's a retired deputy fire chief and captain for the city of Oswego with 22 years on the job. He's noticed a steady increase in Owen's confidence because of the program. In particular, Owen has excelled at engine company operations, especially "hose leads and fire streams," which are methods and skills for extinguishing fires with hose lines, Norfleet said.

"Owen has a positive attitude that's infectious," Norfleet said. "He is eager to try new skills and has a great drive to practice them to mastery level."

Outside of school, Owen volunteers for the Chittenango Fire Department, a role he has held for a little more than a year. He loves learning about firefighting and EMT skills, but he also enjoys other facets of the BOCES class.

"I like the hands-on learning and the people I meet from other schools," he said.

Did You Know?

The New York State Seal of Biliteracy recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency and performance in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to English. Chittenango awarded Seals of Biliteracy in 2024 to eight graduating seniors for Spanish, French and German.
