Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular "check-in" circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close connections with classmates and

teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.

Firefighting & EMT program

This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an onsite classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training

Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.

New! Engineering Technology in Cortland

A new, two-year Engineering Technology Professions program at the OCM BOCES Cortlandville Campus includes exciting partnerships with Cornell University and Tompkins Cortland Community

College (TC3). As part of the class, students delve into the fascinating world of nanoscale science at Cornell's NanoScale Facility and earn up to 10 college credits through TC3. This unique opportunity combines hands-on experience with academic rigor, preparing students for college or careers in engineering and technology fields.

Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

DeRuyter senior Bergen Sperat excels in the OCM BOCES Welding program. He routinely takes the initiative in class and consistently goes above and beyond in his work. For one memorable project, he and his team created a design for a rocket stove—a wood-burning stove with a vertical chimnev-that the whole class ended up using.

"He created a pattern using the CNC (Computer Numerical Control) plasma table, and we used it to cut all the pieces for the stoves that the students then built," said his teacher, Kevin Auyer.

Bergen, known for his friendly personality and leadership skills, first joined the welding program as a junior.

"I like the fact we get to work with our hands and learn in a different way than we do in our home school," he explained. Did You Know?

The DeRuyter Central School District utilized the OCM BOCES Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) for the first time during the 2023-2024 school year. The program provides rigorous grade-level academics within a supportive synchronous virtual environment. Teachers engage students by utilizing technology, delivering interactive lessons, and using breakout rooms for group work. Students also have the option to participate in student council, a virtual talent show, a digital yearbook club, and other activities. DeRuyter has two students participating in the VLA during this 2024-25 school year.



However, it was the dedication of the welding instructors that truly convinced Bergen to enroll.

"When I met the instructors, I saw that they really care about the students, and the program is set up for us to succeed and do good work," Bergen said.

Auyer says Bergen is a highly motivated student.

"He takes pride in his craft and is always evaluating his own work," Auyer said. "Bergen is the kind of student who challenges himself to improve."

Auyer also noted that Bergen is a strong team player and can take on any role in group settings, always showing up with a positive attitude. Those qualities will be helpful to Bergen as he pursues a job in the field after high school. The welding program has already connected him to industry professionals and potential job opportunities.
