Innovation Tech celebrates 10 years!

When Innovation Tech opened its doors in the fall of 2014, this first-ever “New Tech” school in Central New York broke many of the rules of a traditional high school. Students had no assigned desks. They worked in teams on real-world challenges. Teachers, called “facilitators,” encouraged students to direct their own learning.


With the support of its districts and community partners, OCM BOCES took a chance on Innovation Tech and, two years later, on Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland. Today, these OCM BOCES “sister” schools continue to meet the needs of students who flourish in small, close-knit settings with a project-based approach to learning.



Building Community

Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular “check-in” circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close connections with classmates and teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.



Firefighting & EMT program


This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an on-site classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.



Career & Technical Education

OCM BOCES & Fayetteville-Manlius = Student Success



For Fayetteville-Manlius senior Aidan Escaleira, the New Vision Engineering Professions program at Lockheed Martin will soon be a major focus of his college application essay. The program gives Aidan and his classmates a unique opportunity to work side-by-side with Lockheed Martin engineers at the company's complex off Electronics Parkway, rotating through mechanical, electrical, systems, and software disciplines. They also benefit from an on-site classroom and a chance to earn up to six college credits in English and technical writing through Onondaga Community College.

Aidan loves the class. A friend from Fayetteville-Manlius High School recommended it to him after participating in the program last year. This year, Aidan is counting on the program to expose him to a variety of engineering fields so he can select a college and focus on a particular course of study. For now, he's considering a major in mechanical engineering.

“Learning how engineers problem solve and getting a hands-on apprenticeship that can go on my resume will enhance my educational opportunities,” he said.

The program instructor, John Campbell, is a former product designer, quality engineer and college professor. He calls the program “a great transition from high school to college” because it covers multiple aspects of engineering and “basic core skills they will use in college.” Product design, quality engineering, and an introductory lesson on basic electrical circuits are all part of the course. He is also exposing students to Excel, Word and Computer Aided Design because they are used in the industry.

In the early weeks of the program, students used the “Six Sigma” problem-solving technique and a “fishbone” diagram to brainstorm class norms and expectations. They also worked in teams to complete the training required by Lockheed Martin to prepare for their work with the on-site engineers.

Campbell thinks Aidan has a bright future.

“Aidan has the drive to succeed in college and his future engineering challenges,” Campbell said. “The decision to start this year with college credits and an engineering internship will greatly benefit his future success.”

Did You Know?

Fayetteville-Manlius hosted the OCM BOCES Regional Summer School program at Wellwood Middle School for the second year in a row. Because of the district's generosity, students in grades 7 to 12 who had failed a course or Regents examination had an additional opportunity to successfully complete their requirements. Across four OCM BOCES Regional Summer School sites, nearly 3,100 students received help with credit recovery, advancement, and Regents prep and exams. Fayetteville-Manlius had 111 students earn their Health credit with an overall course average of 98.
