Innovation Tech celebrates 10 years!

When Innovation Tech opened its doors in the fall of 2014, this first-ever “New Tech” school in Central New York broke many of the rules of a traditional high school. Students had no assigned desks. They worked in teams on real-world challenges. Teachers, called “facilitators,” encouraged students to direct their own learning.


With the support of its districts and community partners, OCM BOCES took a chance on Innovation Tech and, two years later, on Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland. Today, these OCM BOCES “sister” schools continue to meet the needs of students who flourish in small, close-knit settings with a project-based approach to learning.



Building Community

Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular “check-in” circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close connections with classmates and teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.



Firefighting & EMT program


This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an on-site classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.



Career & Technical Education


Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

OCM BOCES & Lafayette = Student Success



LaFayette senior Madison Quick has long been passionate about nursing. The dedication and care required in the field resonated with her. That’s why, when it came time to explore her options, the OCM BOCES Health Occupations Program felt like the perfect fit.

“Nursing is my passion,” Madison explained. “BOCES seemed like a great way to learn more and get a head start before college.”

The program offers theoretical knowledge and practical experience. In the classroom, Madison and her classmates learn about the intricacies of long-term care, nursing procedures and medical terminology. Outside the classroom, students get more than 100 hours of clinical practice in a long-term care clinical setting. By the end of the two-year program, they can earn a New York State license as a Certified Nursing Assistant. They can also earn an industry-recognized Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas.

Madison was drawn to the program’s clinical aspect. She had the opportunity to work with residents at Loretto, a local long-term care

facility in the Syracuse region. Under the guidance of Mrs. Shawnica Sullivan, one of her clinical instructors, Madison put her textbook knowledge into practice.

“I learned proper care for residents,” Madison shared. “And it was amazing to interact with so many different people at Loretto.”

The program wasn’t just about technical skills. Madison blossomed as a communicator, thanks to the constant interaction with patients and instructors. This newfound strength and her natural compassion made her a true asset in the clinical setting.

“Madison is compassionate and kind when caring for the residents. She’s always the first to volunteer,” Sullivan said.

Melissa McCarthy, her teacher at the OCM BOCES Thompson Road, agreed.

“Madison is a model student in the clinical setting by always being professional,” McCarthy said.

Beyond the immediate benefits, OCM BOCES has helped Madison solidify her aspirations.

“It gave me a great understanding of nursing and even helped me decide which path to take in college,” she said.

Did You Know?

The LaFayette Central School District is deeply committed to supporting the mental health of its students. Several counseling staff members are actively involved in the OCM BOCES Regional Crisis Intervention Team, providing vital assistance to schools that have faced crises such as deaths or suicides. Additionally, the district has partnered with Coordinated Care Services, Inc., to implement suicide prevention programs. The district is also in the process of launching a student-led initiative, “Signs of Suicide,” empowering students to play an active role in promoting mental well-being and identifying potential warning signs.
