Building Community

Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular "check-in" circle in which students and staff share their thoughts, feelings and forge close connections. OCM BOCES is



committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.

Firefighting & EMT program

This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an on-site classroom at the Madison



County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.
