### Building Community


**Restorative Practices:** Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you’ll probably discover a regular “check-in” circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close connections with classmates and teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

**Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI)** is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.



## New! Engineering Technology in Cortland


A new, two-year Engineering Technology Professions program at the OCM BOCES Cortlandville Campus includes exciting partnerships with Cornell University and Tompkins Cortland Community College (TC3). As part of the class, students delve into the fascinating world of nanoscale science at Cornell’s NanoScale Facility and earn up to 10 college credits through TC3. This unique opportunity combines hands-on experience with academic rigor, preparing students for college or careers in engineering and technology fields.

## OCM BOCES & McGraw = Student Success



The two-year Culinary & Pastry Arts program at OCM BOCES has made a dream come true for McGraw senior Racelynn Shellings. She was recently accepted into the prestigious Culinary Institute of America, one of the world's top culinary schools.

Racelynn credits OCM BOCES with elevating her technical skills—a key aspect of her college acceptance—and exposing her to the “intensity of the kitchen, time limits, pressure, and real-life experience,” she said. Socially, she has also bloomed. Culinary teacher Jamie Reed, a former instructor at Cornell University, said Racelynn has grown over the past few years from “being quiet and reserved to a confident leader.”

“Racelynn has become more positive throughout her time here, especially in her outlook on handling pressure in the kitchen,” Reed said.

Recently, two of Racelynn’s projects stood out. She made fresh mozzarella from scratch and a “delicious pumpkin cake” that was offered on a staff meal menu, Reed said.

Racelynn initially enrolled in the program for a simple reason: She loves to cook, and it makes her happy. She says her favorite aspects of BOCES are “getting to meet all of the people who go to school here, having a great teacher, and being able to work with different people in the kitchen.”

She recently passed the Serve Safe Manager Exam, another proud mark in her growing list of accomplishments. Last year, she was a source of knowledge for prospective students. In the kitchen, her generous spirit garners the appreciation of her classmates—and it doesn’t go unnoticed.

“Racelynn is very eager to help out wherever needed,” said Rhonda Moore, a teaching aide.

“She is very helpful to her group, always assisting others,” added Gail Potter, a lunch aide.

## Did You Know?

Two OCM BOCES instructional coaches, Kat Chambers and Lisa Schlegel, work with McGraw elementary teacher teams in grades K-2, in combination with reading AIS teachers, to provide targeted support to enhance reading instruction. The intent is to address reading challenges with effective strategies, using data to guide instructional decisions, organizing students into tiered groups, and planning tailored lessons for each tier. Coaching from OCM BOCES also includes support in navigating multiple programs of instruction, ensuring that these programs complement each other and align with students’ developmental needs.
