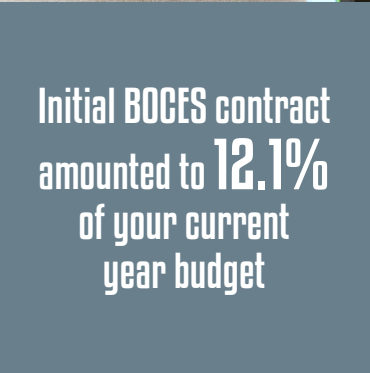
SNAPSHOT OF BOCES SERVICES FOR ONONDAGA CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

Innovation Tech celebrates 10 years!

When Innovation Tech opened its doors in the fall of 2014, this first-ever “New Tech” school in Central New York broke many of the rules of a traditional high school. Students had no assigned desks. They worked in teams on real-world challenges. Teachers, called “facilitators,” encouraged students to direct their own learning.


With the support of its districts and community partners, OCM BOCES took a chance on Innovation Tech and, two years later, on Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland. Today, these OCM BOCES “sister” schools continue to meet the needs of students who flourish in small, close-knit settings with a project-based approach to learning.



Building Community

Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular “check-in” circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close connections with classmates and teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.

Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.



Firefighting & EMT program

This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an on-site classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.




Career & Technical Education

Students who earn a Career & Technical Education endorsement on their high school diplomas have met rigorous academic and industry standards that are recognized by employers and colleges across the United States.

In 2024, these seniors from Onondaga were eligible for CTE endorsements: Bella Cooke, Timothy Coyne, Jason Johnson, Lillian Kahley, Kenadie MacDerment, Wyatt Maloney, and Zackery Slaski.

OCM BOCES & Onondaga = Student Success



Onondaga senior James Corrente is getting a firsthand look at the world of automotive technology through the OCM BOCES Automotive Technology program at Driver's Village. Housed within one of Central New York's largest car dealerships, this two-year Career & Technical Education program offers a unique learning environment for students interested in working on cars and exploring careers in the field.

So far, James has mastered brake repair and troubleshooting techniques. He's also honed his skills in identifying extra resistance in cars to determine the source of the problems. Over the past 10 weeks, he and his classmates have delved into engine mechanics, disassembling and reassembling engines on a stand and precisely measuring critical components with micrometers and calipers.

Recently, the class has shifted its focus to onboard electronic emissions systems, exploring how these systems monitor engine performance, detect failures, and maintain emissions compliance.

James appreciates the program's steady pace. He particularly enjoys the hands-on learning experience and the chance to work on diverse vehicles.

His teacher, Erick Dodge, commends James's growing confidence and leadership qualities. Dodge notes that James is a dedicated student who consistently demonstrates a strong work ethic and inspires his peers.

“James is a quiet leader,” Dodge said. “He is committed to starting and finishing the required work, and his classmates sometimes wait for his lead to begin. His work ethic is what I wish all students possessed.”

While undecided about his future, James is considering military service and leveraging his automotive skills to serve his country. He enthusiastically recommends the OCM BOCES program to his classmates.

“For anyone considering enrolling in BOCES, you should,” he said. “It will not only help you develop skills in the program you are in, but you can also adapt those skills to other situations.”

Did You Know?

The Onondaga Central School District has expanded its capacity to provide preschool programming. The district worked with an OCM BOCES grant writer to develop and submit a competitive grant application. As a result, the district was awarded the New York State UPK Expansion Grant to meet the needs of the district's youngest learners and help them thrive.
