Innovation Tech celebrates 10 years!



When Innovation Tech opened its doors in the fall of 2014, this first-ever “New Tech” school in Central New York broke many of the rules of a traditional high school. Students had no assigned desks. They worked in teams on real-world challenges. Teachers, called “facilitators,” encouraged students to direct their own learning.

With the support of its districts and community partners, OCM BOCES took a chance on Innovation Tech and, two years later, on Seven Valleys New Tech Academy in Cortland. Today, these OCM BOCES “sister” schools continue to meet the needs of students who flourish in small, close-knit settings with a project-based approach to learning.

Building Community



Restorative Practices: Poke your head in almost any OCM BOCES classroom, and you'll probably discover a regular “check-in” circle in which students and staff share their feelings, discuss nearly any topic of interest, and ultimately forge close connections with classmates and teachers. OCM BOCES is committed to using circles and other Restorative Practice techniques to support a positive school culture, maintain healthy relationships, and resolve difficulties.


Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI) is another way OCM BOCES builds community in its Student Services programs. TCI's goal is to create safe, trauma-sensitive environments by training educators to prevent or de-escalate crises therapeutically. TCI also provides students with coping tools to handle stressful situations. School districts can receive TCI training through Cornell University in partnership with OCM BOCES.

Firefighting & EMT program



This two-year Career & Technical Education program gives students access to training facilities, rescue equipment, and the expertise of emergency responders through an on-site classroom at the Madison County Emergency Management Training Center. Students have the opportunity to earn certifications in Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations (BEFO) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic.

Career & Technical Education

OCM BOCES & West Genesee = Student Success



West Genesee eighth-grader Jassiah Knighton has flourished since joining the OCM BOCES Transition Program at Camillus Middle School last year. In addition to his academic success, his friendly and positive presence has made him a beloved member of the school community.

“Jassiah is a pleasure to have in class and provides such joy when he enters the room each day,” said his teacher, Natalie (Sgroi) Capoto. “He has not only formed friendships with all the students in our program, but the students seem to gravitate toward him.”

Capoto attributes much of Jassiah’s success to the program’s small and structured environment, including a consistent schedule and classroom routines. As one example of his progress, Jassiah was reluctant to participate in a personalized learning program called IXL. If he did, he would complete it by working one-on-one with a staff member. Over time, Jassiah began doing IXL activities independently. Now, he excels in various skills and routinely does more than what is asked of him.

Jassiah’s enthusiasm for learning has also been evident during science experiments, including a recent “marshmallow molecules lab” and a “Pringles Challenge” STEM activity, which involves using potato chips to create a ring.

“Jassiah enjoys hands-on work and working with his classroom peers to achieve a common goal,” Capoto said.

The high expectations set by OCM BOCES and Camillus Middle School staff have motivated Jassiah to strive for excellence, including getting better academic scores. He thrives in game-based learning and physical education. His positive attitude is infectious.

“All the kids in our program want to be his friend,” said social worker Katie Brockmyre.

Teaching assistant Kimberly Rode added, “Jassiah thrives on one-on-one interactions with students and staff and lets his personality shine through.”

Did You Know?

The West Genesee Central School District hosted the OCM BOCES Regional Summer School program at Camillus Middle School this past summer. Because of the district’s generosity, students in grades 7 to 12 who had failed a course or Regents examination had an opportunity to successfully complete their requirements. Summer school credit recovery is crucial for helping students stay on track with their education and graduate on time. Across four Regional Summer School sites, nearly 3,100 students received help with credit recovery, advancement, Regents preparation, and exams. West Genesee enrolled students in 225 course seats, 126 Regents exams and 101 Regents review classes.
