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
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## SNAPSHOT OF BOCES SERVICES FOR LYNCOURT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT


### Level Up! Video Game Design is Here

Lyncourt sixth-grader Kimberlyn Hernandez has found a nurturing place to learn and grow through the STAR (Skills Toward Adult Responsibility) program at Homer Junior High School.

Her teacher, Lori Fiumara, credits the program's smaller class size, modified curriculum, additional supports and the dedication of related service providers for helping Kimberlyn reach "her fullest potential."

Even in her first year of the program, Kimberlyn is already showing significant growth, becoming more social, independent and engaged in the classroom.

"Kimberlyn is starting to communicate and socialize much more with peers and teachers," Fiumara said. "She's developing peer relationships within our room along with learning skills."

Kimberlyn enjoys learning through a variety of platforms, including her Chromebook. She especially loves books about history and animals. Recently, she took a strong interest in a geography unit titled, "Continents and the Oceans of our World," impressing both her teacher and classmates with her detailed understanding of the subject.

"She took great pride in completing her final project—a poster—by labeling and locating the continents and oceans," Fiumara said. "She has great geographical knowledge and enjoys sharing her knowledge with her classmates."

That curiosity, along with her sense of humor, makes Kimberlyn a valued and appreciated member of the class.

"She's a nice addition to our classroom!" Fiumara said.

Through the OCM BOCES Community Schools CoSer, our partnership with the Lyncourt Union Free School District has expanded opportunities for students and families. Together, we've supported the Lyncourt Recreation Program, which offers afterschool and weekend activities that strengthen connections and create a sense of belonging for the entire community.
