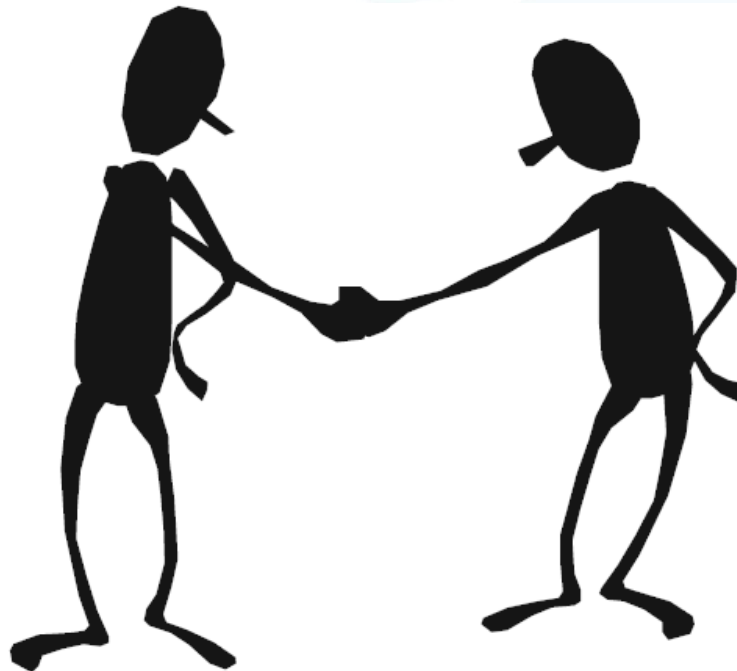

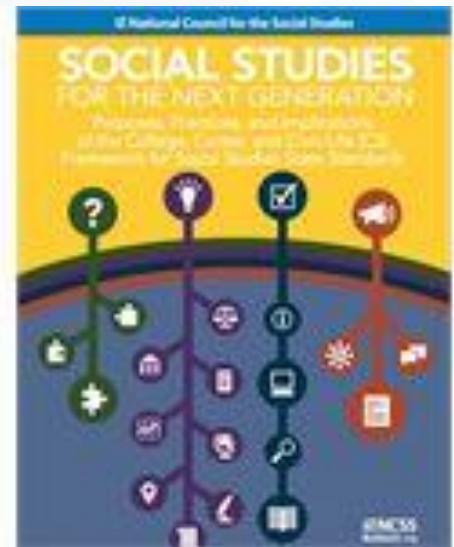
Rationale

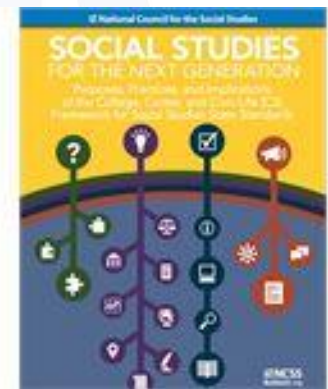

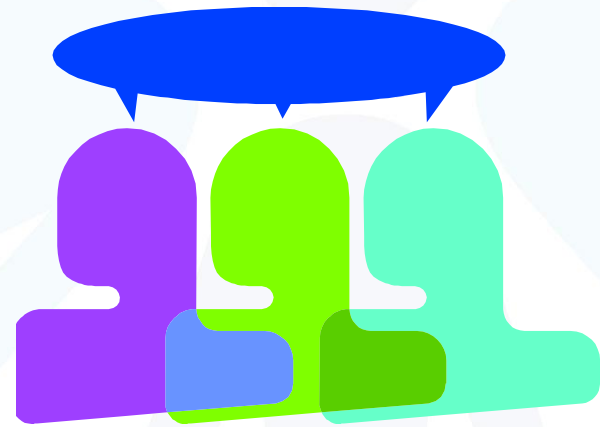
