## **Transition Regents**

- Field testing of items for June 2018 done this spring.
- Fewer Multiple Choice questions, but weighting of sections is the same as with current exam.
- First administration on June 5, 2018 (other Regents administered June 12 through June 22).
- June 15 and June 22 will be Rating Days no State examinations will be administered on these dates. (No Regents Examinations or RCTs will be scheduled on June 15 due to the observance of Eid Al Fitr.)

### **New Test**

- Field testing of items for June 2019 done this spring.
- Teachers have been writing items for all three sections.
- Weighting of sections not yet determined.

### **New Test**

- Both Transition and New Exams will be available from June 2019 to June 2020.
- Districts need to decide:
  - Which test?
  - For which students?
- Transition Exam and New exam will not be given on the same day. New exam will be given earlier to allow for standard setting (in the first year).
   Probably will not know results of New Exam before Transition Exam is given (in the first year)

### **New Test**

- No rule that prevents students from taking both. BUT:
  - Both scores must be reported
  - Considerations of students sitting for two Global Exams (student, parent and teacher concerns)
  - Considerations of what and how students have been taught

## **Enduring Issues Essay**

- Prompt will be the same on every exam. Set of 5 documents will change.
  - At least 1 document from Key Ideas 10.1 to 10.6
  - At least 2 documents from Key Ideas 10.7 to 10.10
  - At least 1 document will be a visual
  - Documents can be used to support more than one enduring issue
- Hybrid of Thematic Essay and DBQ
- List of Enduring Issues and "Nested Issues"


### Students need to:

- Read and analyze the documents.
  - Determine what issues they may represent.
  - Identify a common issue across at least 3 of the documents.
- Define the issue.
- Argue why the issue is significant and has endured across time.
- Use evidence from at least 3 documents and knowledge of social studies to support the argument.

## **Enduring Issues**


- What enduring issue is represented in this document?
- What evidence indicates that it is an enduring issue?
- How has this issue affected people? How have people affected this issue?
- How has this issue continued or changed over time?

#### Projected Global Water Scarcity, 2025



- Physical water scarcity: More than 75% of river flows are allocated to agriculture, industries, or domestic purposes. This definition of scarcity relating water availability to water demand implies that dry areas are not necessarily water-scarce.
- Approaching physical water scarcity: More than 60% of river flows are allocated. These basins will experience physical water scarcity in the near future.
- Economic water scarcity: Water resources are abundant relative to water use, with less than 25% of water from rivers withdrawn for human purposes, but malnutrition exists.
- **Little or no water scarcity:** Abundant water resources relative to use. Less than 25% of water from rivers is withdrawn for human purposes.
- Not estimated
