- Number of instructional, non-instructional and administrative staff: 812
- The 2024-25 general fund budget is \$111,254,879. The district has a taxable assessed value of nearly \$3.5 billion.
- Fayetteville-Manlius offers a comprehensive academic program. This includes accelerated, Regents and honors courses in multiple subject areas and an interdisciplinary honors course in English and social studies for students in grades 9 and 10. Students can also take advantage of 18 Advanced Placement courses and dual college enrollment courses through Suracuse University Project Advance (SUPA), SUNY Environmental Science and Forestry (ESF), Onondaga Community College (OCC) and SUNY Oswego.
- For the Class of 2024, 77% of graduates went on to four-year colleges, 14% went on to two-year colleges, and 8% chose other post-secondary institutions, work or the military.
- F-M buses travel about 780,460 miles annually, with 41 routes serving students in the 42.73-square-mile school district and 13 routes to stops outside the district.
