Kindergarten Curriculum - for children age 6 or older

Please note – according to NYS regulations no Letter of Intent, IHIP, Quarterly Reports or Year-End Assessment are necessary for Children 5 and under. *Education Law 3205 requires children who turn six on or before December 1 to receive instruction from the start of the school year in September of that year. Children who turn six after December 1 must begin to receive instruction no later than the first day of school the following September.

Kindergarten doesn't have a required curriculum, although Letter of Intent, IHIP, Quarterly Reports and Year-End Assessment are still necessary if your child's age mandates reporting*. Kindergarten might include: Reading Readiness, Math Readiness, Language Development, Health Education including personal safety and AIDS instruction, Music, Physical Education, In addition-patriotism and citizenship, alcohol/drugs/tobacco abuse, bicycle/highway safety.
